e-Health: The New Norm, The New Competency

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Overview and Highlights

Starting the Fall semester of 2021 after a whole year of remote and hybrid education, the Family and Community Medicine department was motivated to return to in-person education, and an in person full blown 9th Health Exhibition! The Team consisting of the chair of the Department of Family and Community Medicine, Dr. Baraa Alghalyini, and department faculty, Dr. Racha Khalid and Dr. Salim Alkodaymi started planning for this joyous occasion from day one of the semester. For the topic, we were inspired by the inspiring surge in technological adoption and development to fight the COVID-19 pandemic, in addition to how that highlighted some technological hidden gems and showed our flexibility as a society. For that reason, we settled on e-health and its developments, highlighting the pre and post-covid applications and the future of these technologies.

The 350+ students were divided into 31 groups, each discussing a rich variety of topics.

The event was planned to use the entire Alfaisal campus to portray the booths. All Alfaisal students and faculty were invited, including the students' friends and family, school students from all over Riyadh, and the general public. As the event day was nearing,

experts with medical and technological backgrounds from Alfaisal and other national universities were contacted. Those who showed interest were given a specially developed and compiled judge package containing a scientific rubric to score the groups and an explanation about the event. The 15 enlisted judges ranged in expertise from clinical medicine to public health to artificial intelligence.

On the day of the event, the doors were open to visitors from 9 am all the way until 9 pm. We estimate that more than 1000 guests attended our event during that time. In addition to 31 student booths, we included two booths run by the student clubs and supervised by the Medical Student Association. The the Life support booth to teach visitors about the importance of basic life support training, and the adopt-a-plant booth to raise awareness on environmental issues. The judges rotated on their assigned booths and the winners will be announced shortly in an awarding ceremony to celebrate all the wonderful effort, not just by the winners, but also by all the students who helped and participated, and the faculty and judges who were involved.

Roadmap

Brief:

This year's Health Promotion project is also quite innovative and strongly supported by evidence from the literature and successful examples from around the world.

Theme:

Alfaisal 9th Health Promotion "Hub" e-Health: The New Norm, The New Competency.

Vision:

Exploring the future of the inspiring surge in technological adoption and development during the pre and post covid periods.

Goals:

To enrich the course with a creative student project that can promote the currently highly debated and researched concept of Digital Health and its emergent use during the COVID-19 pandemic and the inevitability of it becoming a major source for health services. This also is concurrent with the department members' efforts to establish a digital health service under the umbrella of Alfaisal University.

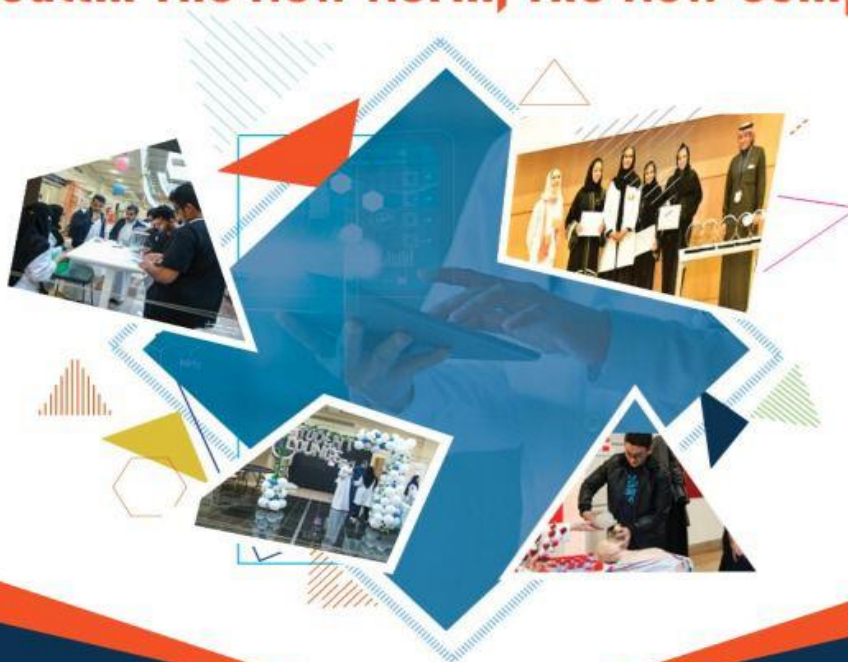

Introduction

Agenda

This year's 9th Health promotional Exhibition comes back with a theme inspired by the recent pandemic we faced and its role as a catalyst in the e-health revolution sweeping health systems worldwide. In addition, there will be 32 booths discussing different aspects of e-health, including pre-covid and post-covid applications, challenges & difficulties, and the future of these health fields and innovations. The student will have no more than 10 minutes to present their topic to the judges and answer any questions.

Judging criteria details

Impact: what you feel when you first view it. Does it evoke an emotion? Does it engage you from the onset?

Creativity: how the group was able to convey their idea, message or thought in an original and imaginative way through their design, narrative, performance, etc.

Style: how the group can showcase their personal originality and technique to influence how the material is presented and interpreted.

Subject Matter: was the subject matter addressed in the design and materials?

Story Telling: how the group is able to let their materials and design evoke the attendees' imagination.

Presentation criteria

Originality and Creativity: uniqueness of ideas and approaches to tackle the topic.

Neatness of material: presentation is organized and, clear of unnecessary elements, easy to follow.

Familiarity with subject matter: exhibits knowledge of the subject matter and confidently answers questions.

Presentation skills: exhibits good body posture, maintains good eye contact with the audience, good diction, and good articulation.

Organization (Logical presentation of ideas): objectives/goals are clearly stated, Thoughts and ideas flow in a logical manner, and the information achieve the intended purpose of the project.

Each criterion will be scored out of 10 representing the following:

0-2 Unsatisfactory

3-5 Acceptable

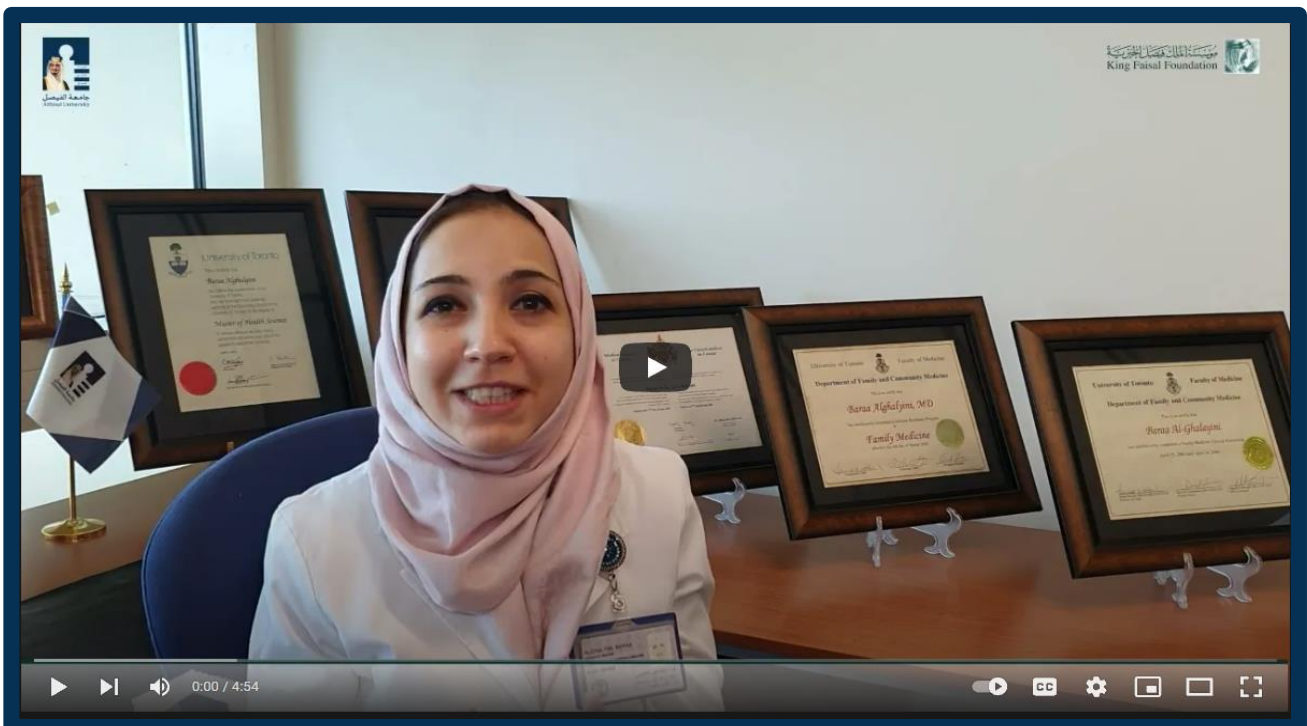
6-8 satisfactory

9-10 exemplary.

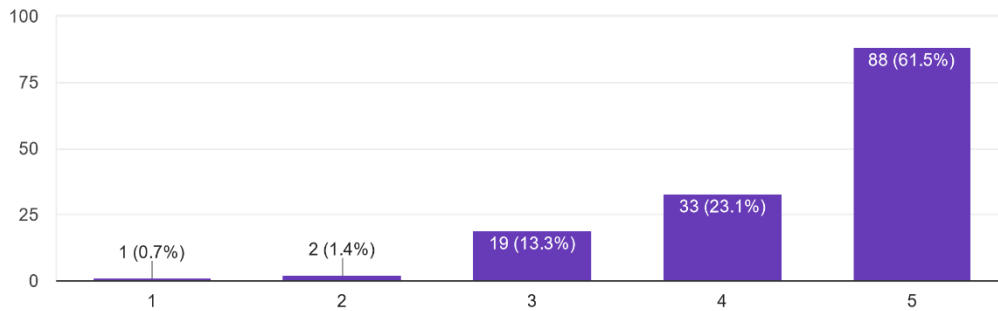

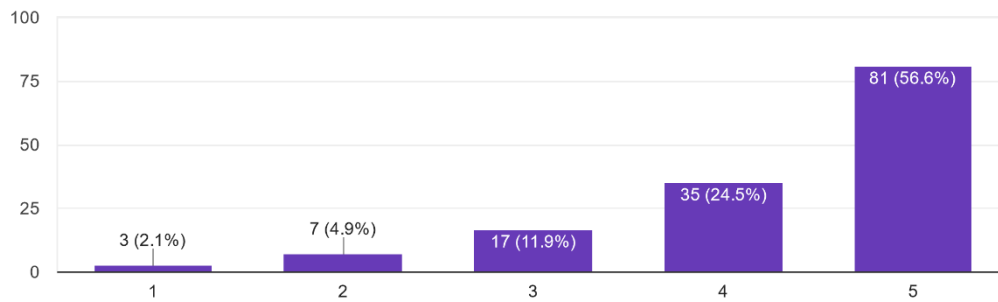
1) From 1-5, in your opinion how much did this experience benefit you in building communication skills?

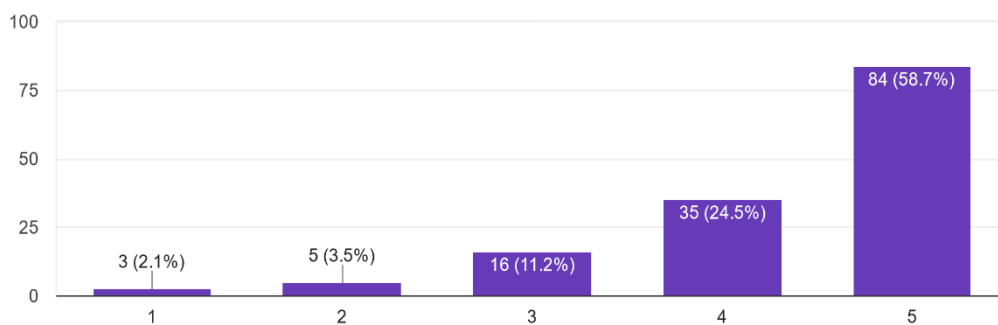
2) From 1-5, in your opinion how much did this experience benefit you in building organization skills?

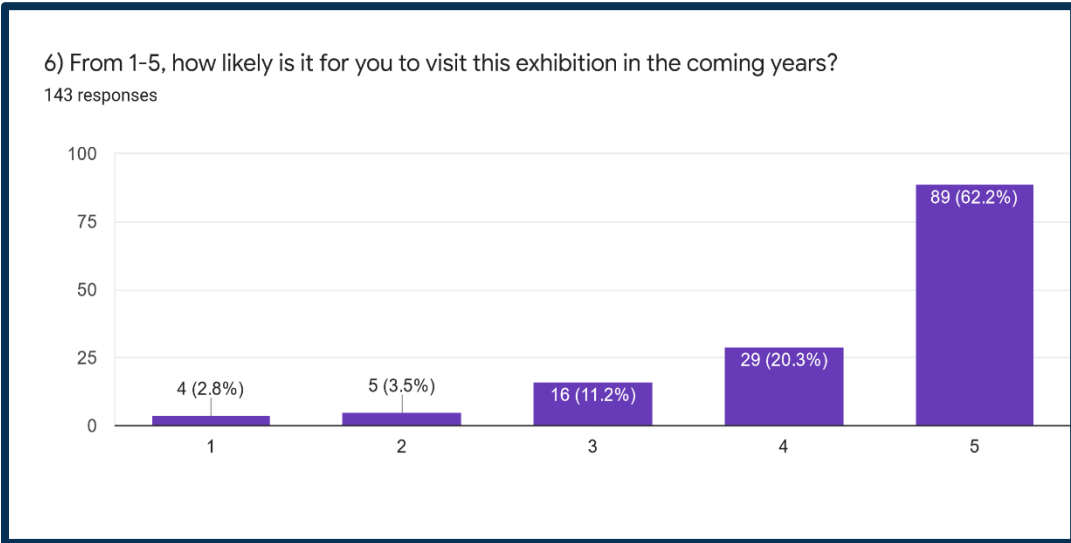
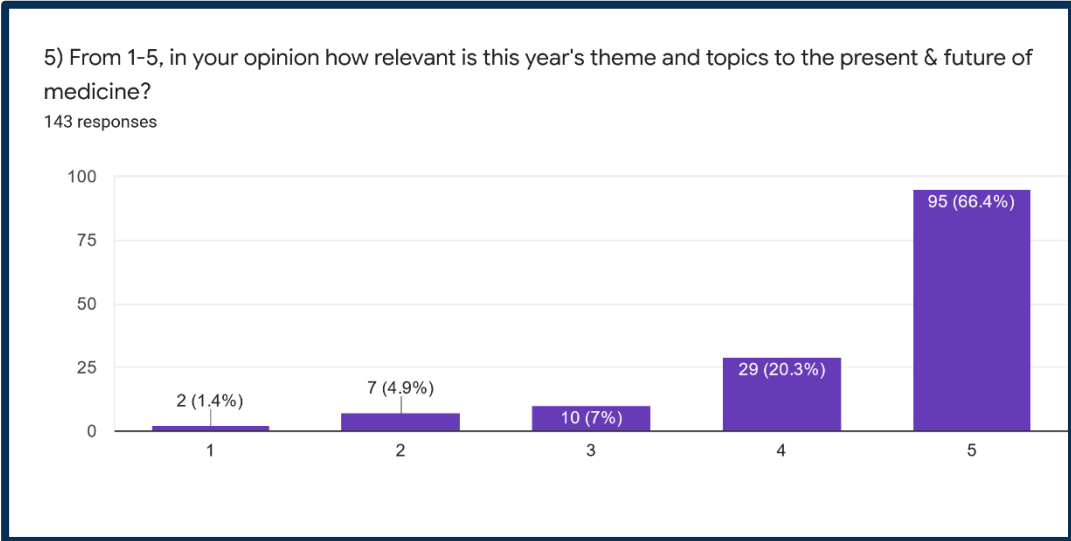
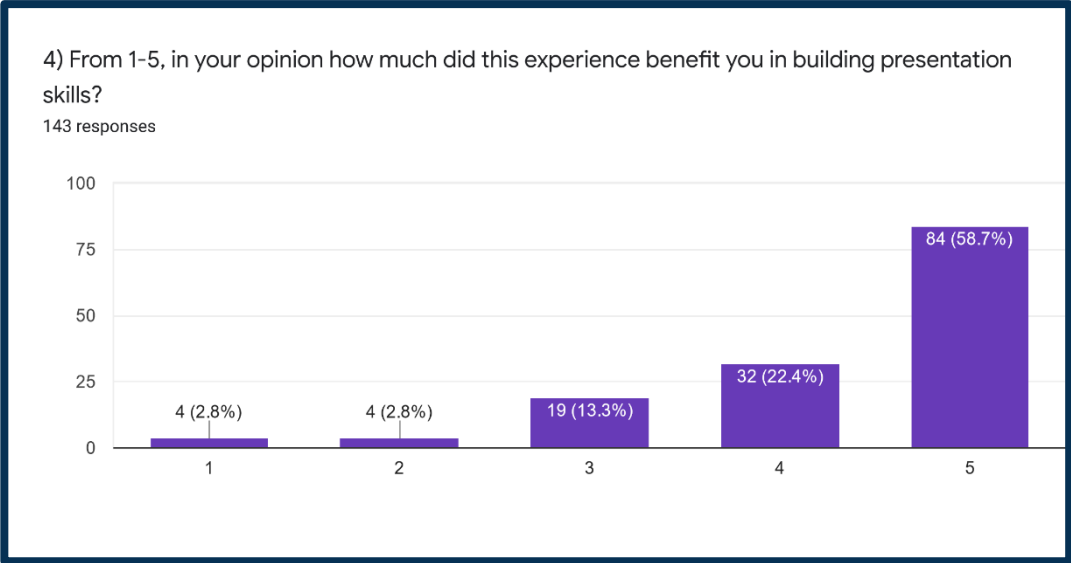
