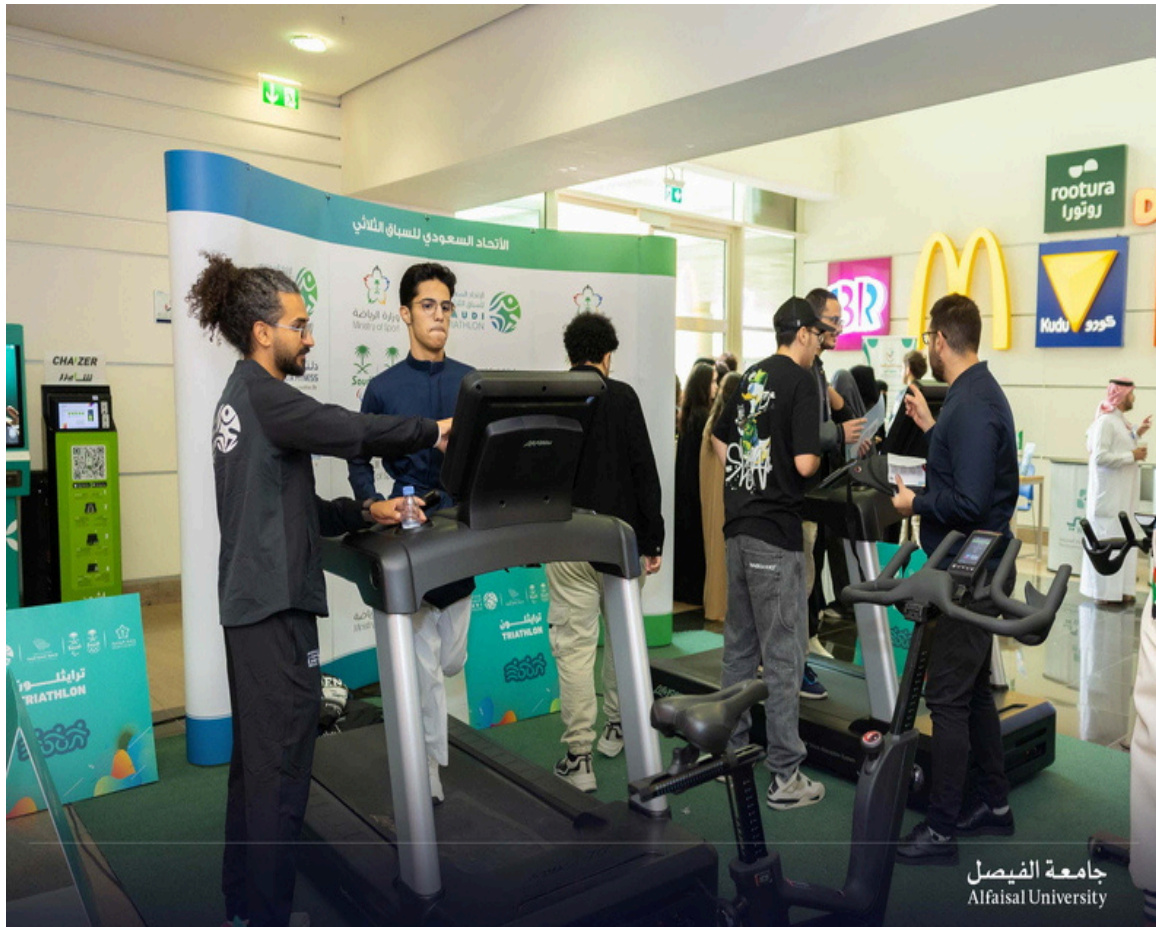






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Overview

The **12th Annual Health Promotion Project (HPP)** at **Alfaisal University**, organized by the **Family and Community Medicine Department**, was a landmark event emphasizing patient safety and preventive medicine. Themed "**Harmony in Healthcare: A Culture of Patient Safety**," the event highlighted the integration of safety practices in healthcare environments while engaging over **550 first-year medical students** in research-driven learning and public health awareness.

This year's **HPP exhibition** was the **largest** to date, featuring **50 interactive booths** where students presented innovative healthcare solutions to faculty, professional judges, and community members. The event also expanded its **community outreach**, inviting **local high schools** to enhance early health education and foster a culture of patient safety among younger generations.

Students participated in **interactive presentations**, showcasing topics such as **antimicrobial stewardship, healthcare sustainability, 3D bioprinting, and AI-driven patient safety solutions**. Each group had **10 minutes** to present their research and answer judges' questions, ensuring a structured and engaging learning experience.

- **Youth Engagement** – High school tours to educate and inspire future healthcare professionals.
- **National Collaboration** – Renowned doctors and experts from across Saudi Arabia served as judges and mentors.
- **Competitive Learning Environment** – Students participated in four judging categories:
 1. Creative Booth Design
 2. Best Content & Presentation
 3. Most Challenging Topic
 4. Outstanding Overall Booth
- **Impact Assessment** – Online research survey to measure the HPP's influence on attendees and participants.
- **Professional Networking** – Facilitated discussions between healthcare providers and students through a networking lunch.
- **Awards & Recognition** – Winners were celebrated in a prestigious ceremony, honoring their contributions with certificates and distinguished prizes.

By combining **education, research, and community engagement**, HPP 2024 successfully reinforced **Alfaisal University's** commitment to shaping future **healthcare leaders and advancing patient safety in Saudi Arabia**.

The Health Promotion Project (HPP) is an initiative led by the **Family & Community Medicine Department** at Alfaisal University's College of Medicine, dedicated to fostering a culture of health education, research, and community engagement. Together, we worked to advancing **health promotion** through **research, innovation, and interactive learning experiences**. Our mission is to **empower** future healthcare professionals with the **skills and knowledge** necessary to drive positive change in public health. Through the **Health Promotion Project**, we aim to bridge the gap between **medical education and real-world health challenges**, preparing students to be proactive in addressing **public health concerns** and advocating for **patient-centered care**.

History of the Health Promotion Project

The **HPP** was initiated over a decade ago by the Family and Community Medicine Department as a **pioneering initiative** to integrate public health education, research, and community engagement into medical training. The project was designed to **enhance first year medical students'** understanding of **preventive medicine** while fostering **essential** skills in **scientific communication**, critical thinking, and interdisciplinary collaboration.

How It Started & Achievements: Initially, the Health Promotion Project (HPP) began as a **small-scale** event with **20-30 student** groups, aimed at encouraging students to translate complex medical concepts into interactive and engaging public health messages. Over the years, the project has grown **significantly**, with participation expanding to over **550 students** this year, forming **50 groups**. As the event has evolved, it has gained recognition both **locally** and **nationally**, attracting **professional** judges, healthcare experts, and faculty from diverse disciplines. In addition local schools were invited to attend, allowing students to engage with the broader public and promote awareness of healthcare topics, emphasizing the importance of **early health education**, which has further enhanced its credibility and reach. This growth reflects **Alfaisal University's** commitment to innovation in medical education and community outreach.

Mentorship Process and Research Support

- **Walk-in Research Clinics**

Under the guidance of **Dr. Abdul Rehman Zia Zaidi**, the Department of Family & Community Medicine implemented a comprehensive mentorship program through weekly Thursday walk-in research clinics. These sessions served as a vital resource for first-year medical students participating in the Health Promotion Project, providing structured yet flexible support throughout their research journey.

- **Structure and Accessibility**

Weekly Thursday sessions with dedicated 15-minute time slots for each group:

- Structured appointment system to ensure fair and efficient distribution of mentorship time
- On-call email support system for urgent queries and literature review guidance
- Open-door policy allowing students to seek additional guidance at critical points
- Flexible scheduling to accommodate different student groups
- One-on-one mentoring opportunities
- Group consultation sessions

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Day of the Event

- **Event Participation & Engagement:**

Annual Health Promotion Project (HPP) began at the start of the **Fall 2024** semester, led by the **Family and Community Medicine Department** to ensure a structured and impactful experience for students. Inspired by advancements in **health promotion and primary healthcare**, the event focused on **artificial intelligence (AI)**, **sustainability**, **health equity**, and **patient safety**—reflecting the growing integration of research-driven strategies in modern healthcare.

Under the theme “**Harmony in Healthcare: A Culture of Patient Safety**,” the project explored critical topics such as:

- Medication errors and prevention strategies
- Enhancing communication for patient safety
- AI's role in reducing medical risks
- Climate change and its impact on patient safety
- Suicide prevention in healthcare settings in Saudi Arabia

To bring these themes to life, **550+ students** were divided into **50 groups**, each focusing on a **specific area of patient safety**. Their work involved **comprehensive literature reviews**, identifying research gaps, and proposing **innovative healthcare solutions**. Each group developed **mini-research posters** and interactive booths to engage the public in meaningful discussions.

Day of the Event

The **exhibition day** was a culmination of months of research, where students showcased their findings through **presentations, hands-on demonstrations**, and **discussions with faculty, healthcare professionals, and judges**. The event emphasized **evidence-based medicine, public health advocacy, and interdisciplinary collaboration**, equipping students with **critical research and communication skills** essential for future healthcare leaders.

- **Key Features of the Booths:**

- Interactive models, digital presentations, and live demonstrations
- Posters and brochures summarizing key health messages
- Engaging discussions with faculty members and professional judges
- Hands-on activities to enhance audience participation.

The booths were set up in a structured layout, allowing smooth movement of attendees, including students, faculty, and invited guests. The event provided a real-world simulation of how medical professionals engage in community health promotion.

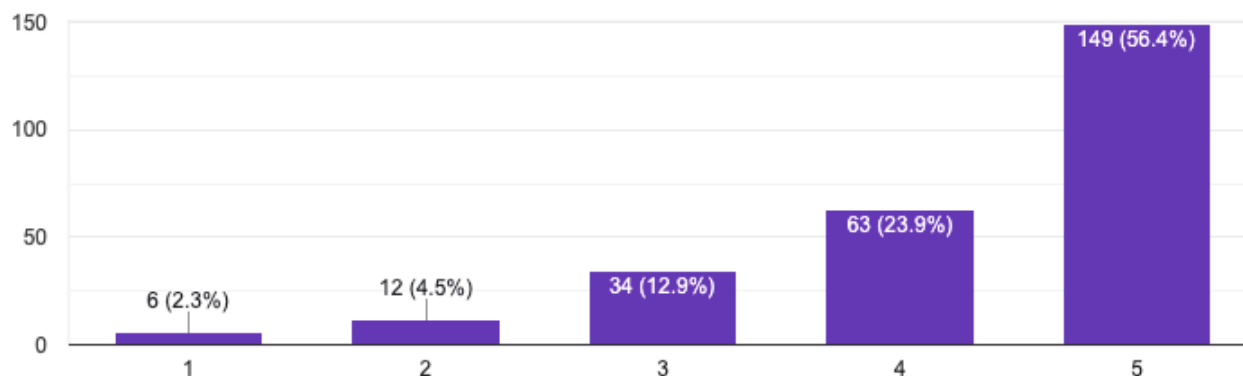

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1. This project helped me learn how to search for medical/scientific literature on patient safety topics

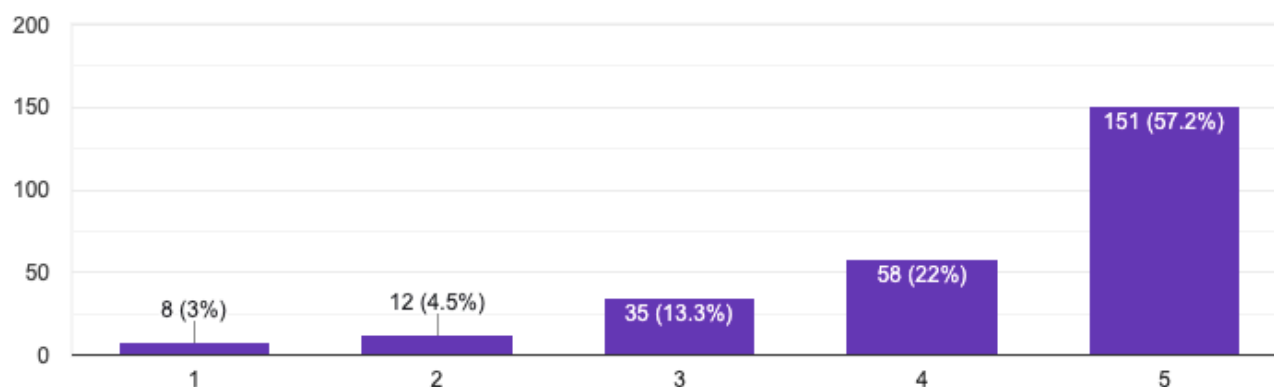

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2. This project helped me understand how to appraise research articles in medical journals related to patient safety

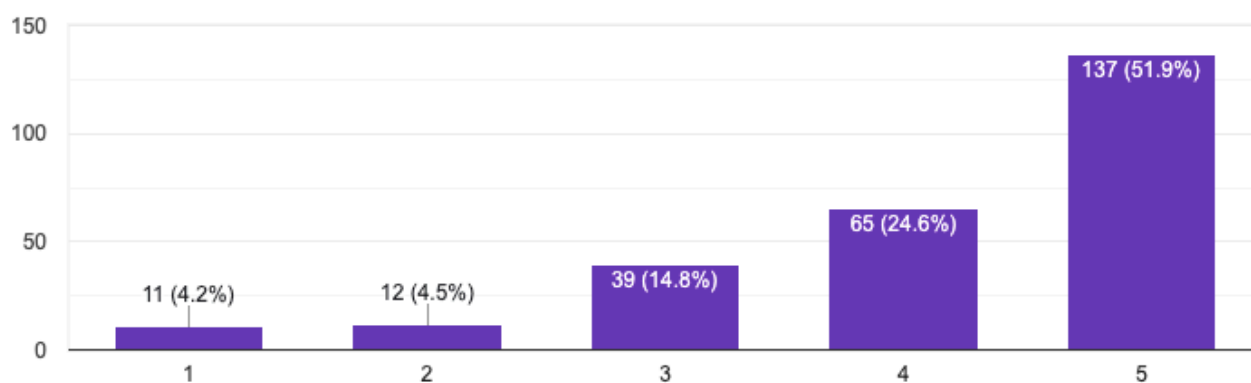

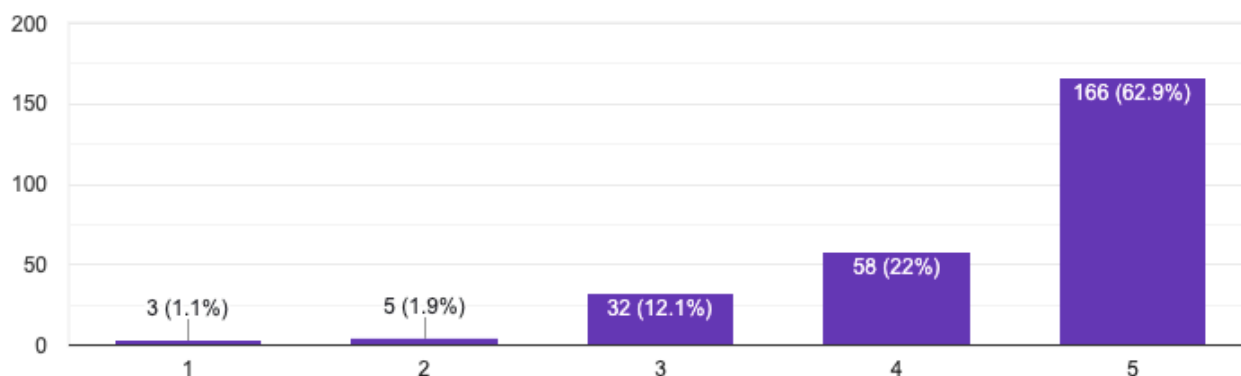

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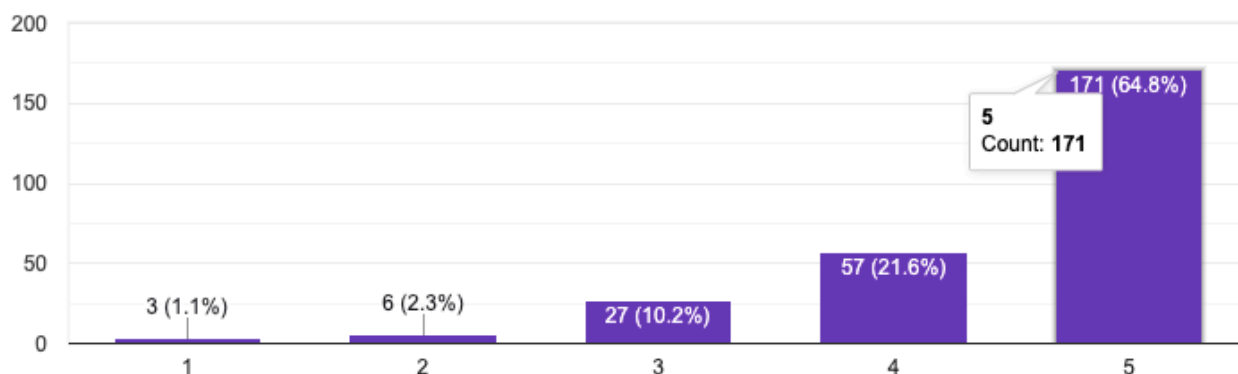

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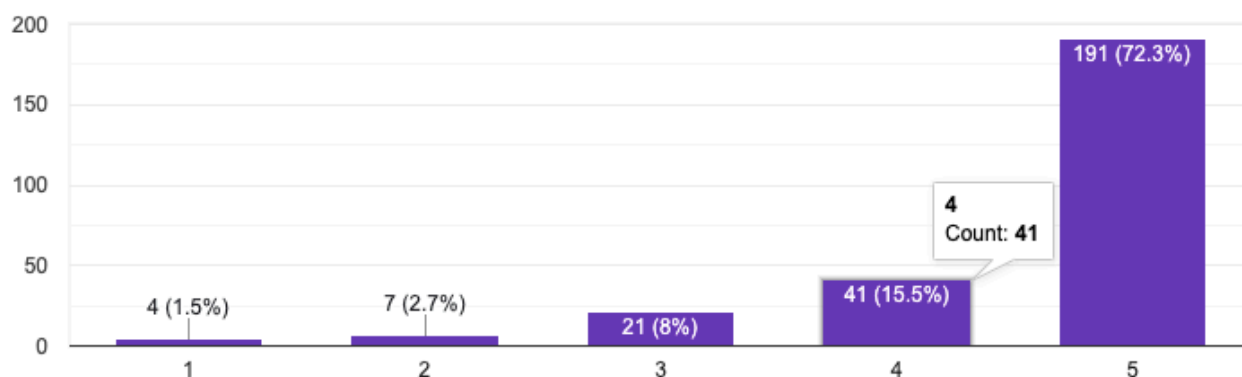

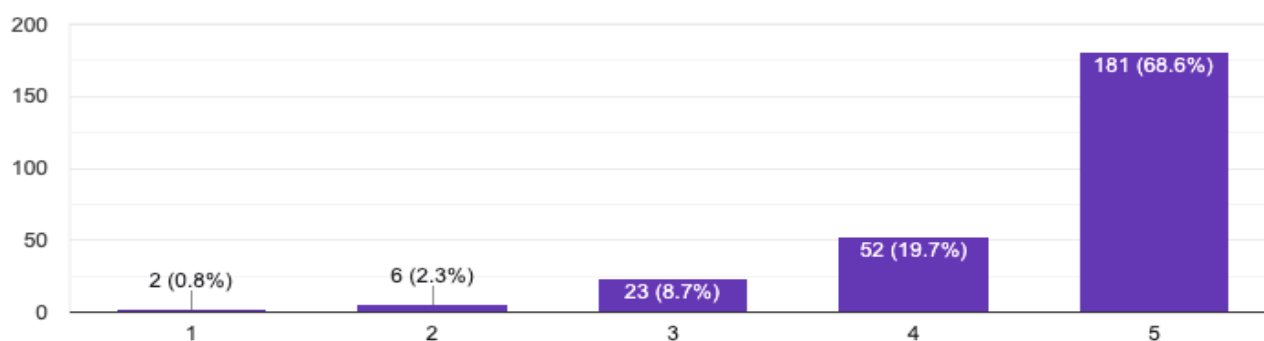

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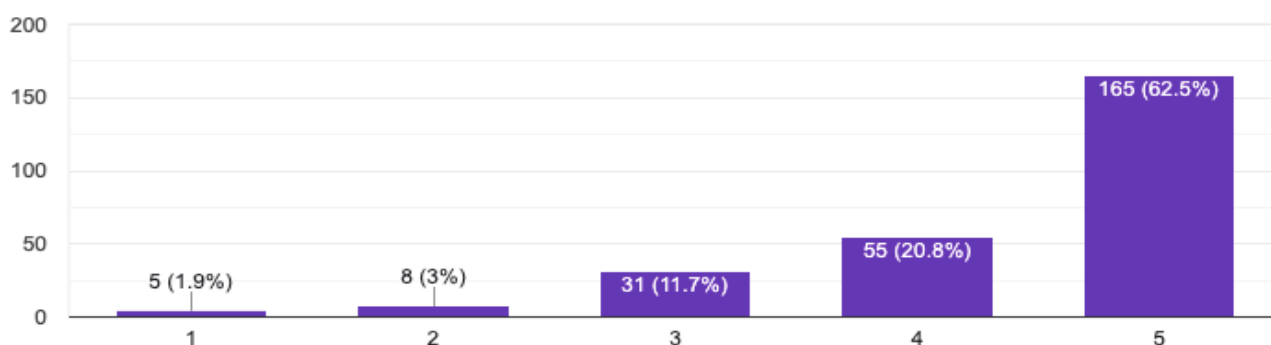

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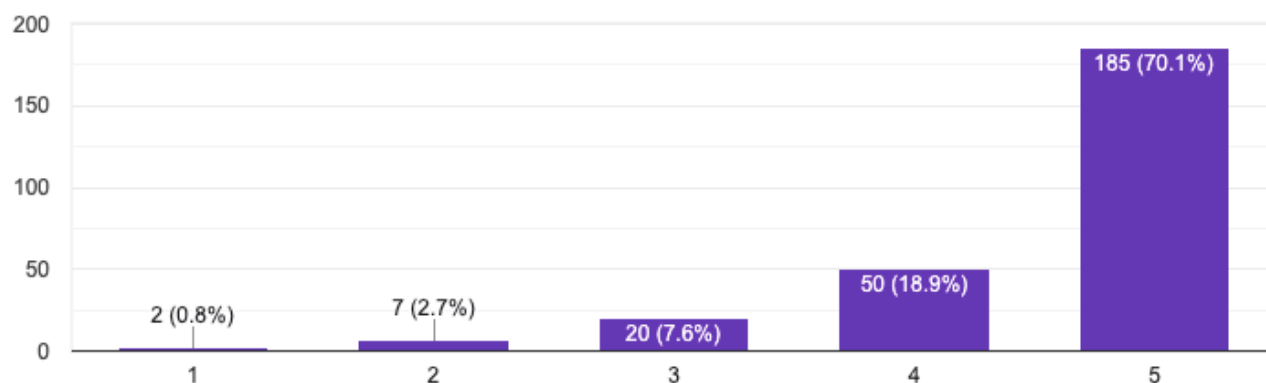
